And God spoke all these words saying, "I am the Lord God Lord thy God which have brought thee out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of bondage. Thou shalt have no other gods before me," (Ex 20:1-3). Unlike man, God does not change. He said, "For I am the Lord, I change not." (Mal 3:6). Yet grievous wolves came into the Christian churches set up by the disciples. They changed the laws of God to worship idols (Acts 20:29-30). The so called Christian churches of today have become so deceived by false doctrine that they preach that the laws of God are done away with, or that it is no longer necessary to obey the law of God. But what did God say about them? "To the law and the testimony: if they speak not according to this word, it is because there is no light in them" (Is 8:20).

When were the laws of God established? They were established from the foundation of the world and man received God's verbal laws. However man disobeyed him from the beginning, starting with Adam and Eve.

The very first law was to obey the Lord with all your heart, soul and might, which Adam did not do. God ended his work on the seventh day and rested from his work and this is when he established the Sabbath. This was not a Jewish law, but was established from the beginning of time. But what did man do instead? They took the first day of the week, the day that the heathen worshipped the sun, and called it the Sabbath, the Lord's Day. God put man and woman together from the beginning, he said, "Therefore shall a man leave his father and mother, and shall cleave unto his wife: and they shall be one flesh" (Genesis 2:24). Yet, they commit adultery and fornication. We know that the first murder was done by Cain who killed Abel. Cain was a murderer, a liar, and disobedient to God and his parents. When God told Cain sin lieth at his door, there had to be a law for there to be sin. "Sin is the transgression of the law" (1 John 3:4). Due to the wickedness of man and his refusal to obey, God sent a flood and destroyed all except eight souls in the ark, as a remnant of them who would obey. For verily I say unto you, till heaven and earth pass, one jot or one tittle shall in no wise pass from the law till all be fulfilled" (Matt 5:17-18).

But God punishes man little by little to give him a chance to repent for his sins before judgment comes down on his head. As in the days of Noah God said, "The earth is defiled under the inhabitants there of; because they have transgressed the laws, changed the ordinances and broken the everlasting covenant" (Is 24:5).
